Snow Removal Plan

The City of Raleigh has a snow removal plan for its road system. It is designed for 2-4 inch snow coverage with rising temperatures as well as for severe snow storms.

Salt is spread when accumulations are under two inches. Snow plowing begins when snow exceeds two inches.

City roads are cleared in the following order:

- 1) Bridges
- 2) Major thoroughfares
- 3) All bus routes
- 4) Major residential areas
- 5) Other residential/hazardous areas
- 6) Other areas not covered in previous priorities



The GoRaleigh Plan

The City of Raleigh Department of Transportation also has a plan for its bus service during snow and sleet conditions. This plan is based on the City's policy of continuing bus service at the highest level possible as long as reasonably safe.

The plan consists of an abbreviated route system that becomes effective when conditions prevent running an entire bus route.

Service may also be temporarily discontinued where the accumulation of unplowed snow on major thoroughfares prevents buses from maneuvering. Transit operations are essential and any suspended service will be as brief as possible.



Getting the Latest Information on Bus Routes During Adverse Weather

The City of Raleigh Department of Transportation provides the latest information to the public to keep you informed of transit service changes. The four levels of GoRaleigh bus service are:

Level 1: Full bus service provided under normal conditions.

Level 2: Normal service with delays or early shutdown and possible detours.

Level 3: Weekend level service, potential detours.

Level 4: No service

All levels of service could experience detours and delays or changes in scheduled service. Please keep the information below handy to get the very latest from GoRaleigh.
